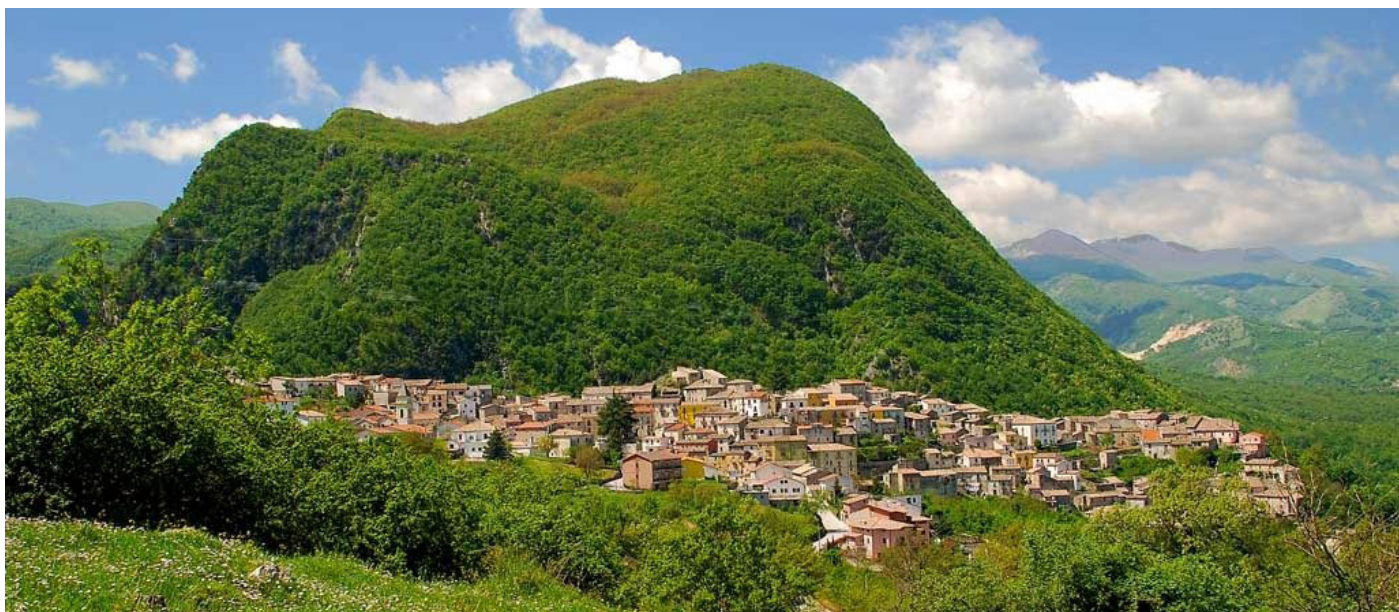


Figure 2. Protected area of Guardiaregia-Campochiaro

GENERAL INFORMATION

Collecting

In the area surrounding the congress site, the collection of insects does not require special permits. The collections made in protected areas and Parks can only be carried out after receiving appropriate permits.

Climate and weather

Molise enjoys a warm and temperate climate with significant rainfall throughout the year. In Campobasso the average temperature in June is around 20°C. But it is always recommended to check the local forecast before going out.

Currency

Italy is part of the European EURO Zone, and Euro is the used currency. ATMs are common in cities and towns, but may be scarce in rural areas. Major credit cards are accepted in most stores and restaurants, but it is recommended that visitors carry sufficient supply of cash.

Visa

Italy belongs to the European Union, so visitors from member states do not need visa. Visitors from other countries should check visa requirements with their local Italian embassy before registering. An invitation letter can be provided after registration and send to the participants.

SUPPORT FOR MEMBERS

The SEL council has some funds available to support members who would like to attend the SEL conference but have insufficient funds themselves. Grants are awarded to individuals to cover expenses associated with transport, registration, hotel, meals, poster printing, etc. SEL cannot afford to pay the full costs, but will try to use the funds in the best possible way.

These grants are competitive and reviewed by a panel. Any submitted applications without all the required documents listed below will not be considered. All grantees are required to give a presentation (poster or talk). We especially encourage applications from students and amateurs who lack financial means to attend the congress.

Required elements for grant consideration

The following documents *must* be included in the application in a single pdf file: 1) Letter of motivation including a statement as to why attendance of the SEL conference is considered important for the applicant's career and/or activities (max. one A4 page); 2) short CV; 3) title of the proposed presentation including an abstract following the guidelines found at the registration page; 4) a short budget plan, including all expected expenses and other potential sources of subsidy; include the amount of money that you need from SEL. SEL subsidies will most likely be in the range of EUR 300–500 maximum.

4. If you are presenting newly described taxa, state to which superfamily and family the new taxon belongs, explain the etymology, show the taxon distribution on a map and some photographs of the habitat of the new taxon, if possible.

When registering, please mention that you want to present a 3-min talk (and not the common 20-min one).
NOTE: a three minute talk is also mandatory for all poster presenters!

Life stages of *Nomophila noctuella* (Crambidae: Spilomelinae) on *Azolla* spp. (Salviniaceae)

Nomophila noctuella (Denis & Schiffermuller) and *Diasemiopsis ramburialis* (Duponchel) are two migratory moths belong to Spilomelinae (Crambidae). Both species were recently found feeding on *Azolla* spp. (Salviniaceae, water ferns) in the northern region of Iran and had almost similar feeding activity and damage symptoms. We compare the two species' feeding behavior on the new host plant and during this survey we photographed all life stages of both species on *Azolla* spp. We described *D. ramburialis* life stages before and the life stage photos were published as well. In addition, results from our comparative studies are going to be published in future.

Nomophila noctuella (Fig. 1) is known to be a polyphagous species, which is associated with numerous host plants worldwide and its life stages were described before; therefore a new description is not necessary. In addition, *Myriophyllum* spp. (Haloragaceae) were other recorded aquatic host plants for this moth. However, the moth is known as an above-water defoliator, and feeds on shoots of this host plant. *Azolla* spp. are free floating plants. Therefore, for the terrestrial larvae of this moth, the feeding behavior and the habitual shelter-making behavior, which keep them from drowning, are important and a key factors for their survival on a new aquatic host. Therefore, we thought photos of different life stage of this moth on the new host plant with a short description for each stage would be interesting.

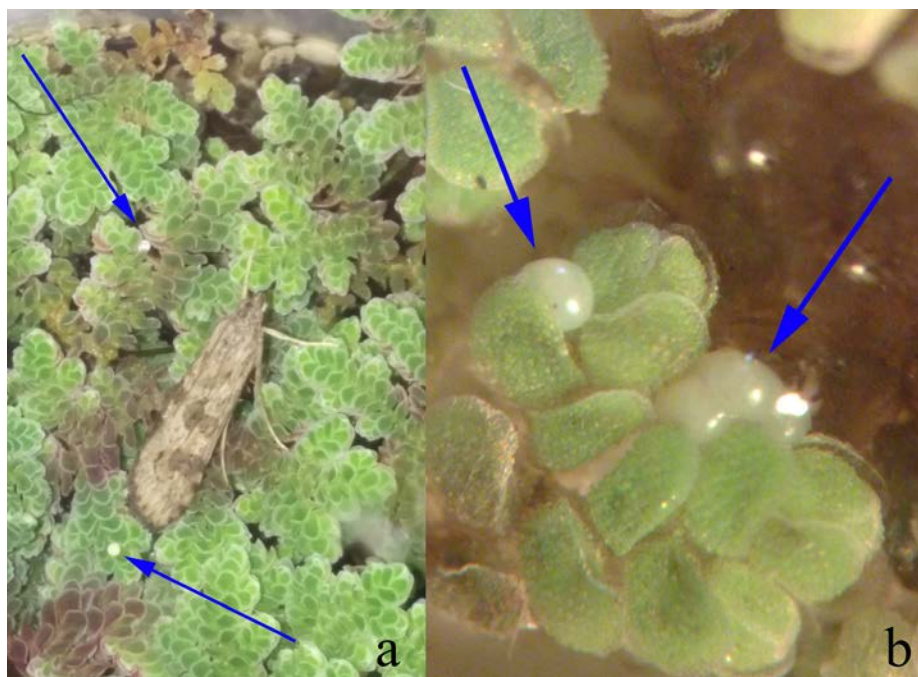


Figure 2. *Nomophila noctuella* eggs on *Azolla* spp. (a: a female and its freshly laid eggs; b: eggs)

Eggs are globular, off-white in color and laid singly or in groups of two or three on *Azolla* spp. leaves or smooth surfaces of other materials near the food plant (Fig. 2).

Freshly hatched larvae are pale with black head capsule and have sparse setae on their body. As the

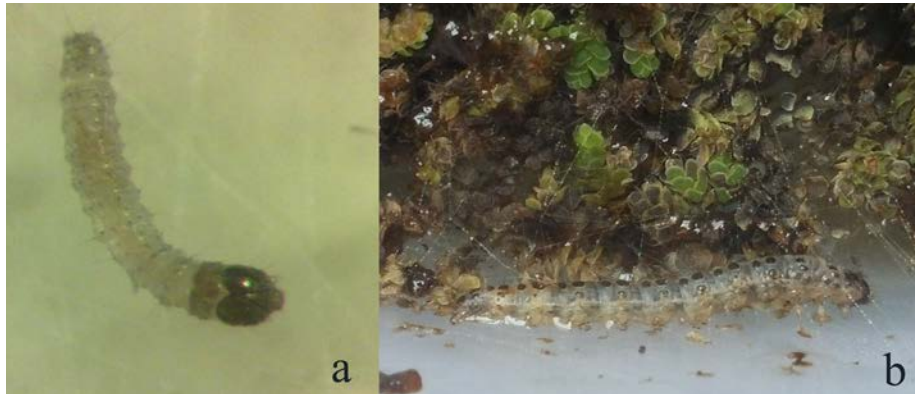


Figure 3. *Nomophila noctuella* larvae (a: first instar larva; b: last instar larva on *Azolla* spp.)

larva develops, its color becomes darker, the setae increase in length, and dark spots appear at the base of the setae. The final-instar larva is greenish brown with black head capsule. (Fig. 3)

Pupation usually takes place on the water-fern surface or higher places near the food plant in a thin silky case (Fig. 4)

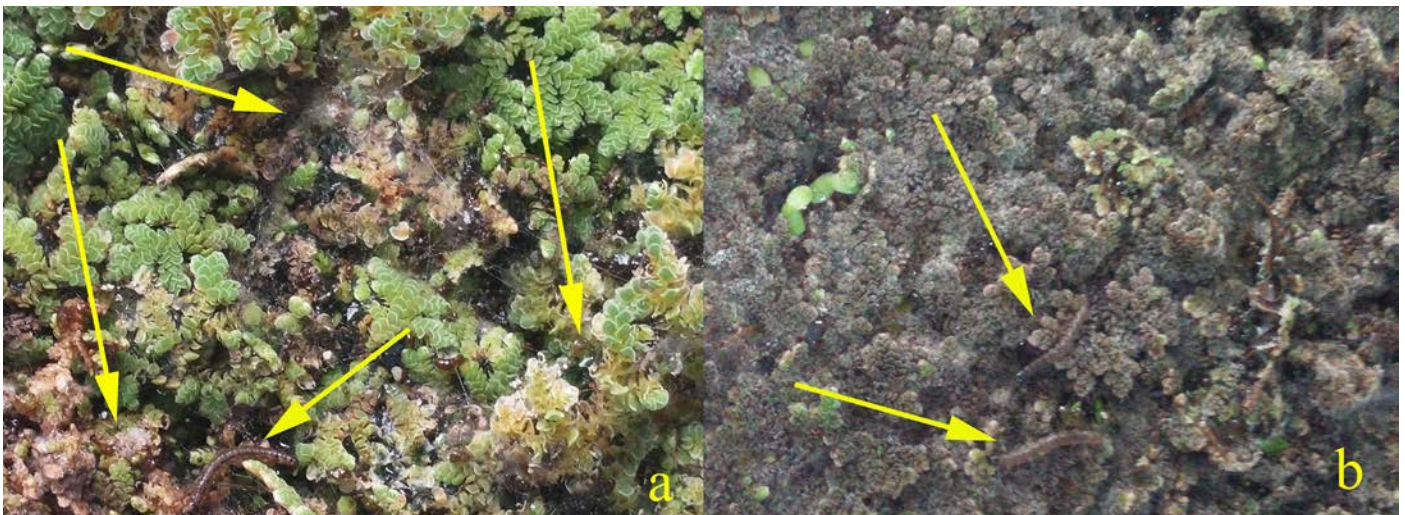


Figure 5. *Nomophila noctuella* damage symptoms on *Azolla* spp. (a: larval shelters and a wandering larva; b: decomposed water fern at the end of larvae feeding activity with two wandering larvae)

Larvae are phyllophagous and build shelters by binding leaves together with silk and remain hidden in their shelters when they are not actively feeding. When larvae mature, they leave their shelter and wander on water fern leaves in silky tunnels filled with frass (Fig. 5a). Feeding damage by larvae facilitated the infection of water fern with bacteria and fungi (Fig. 5b).

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Uresiphita gilvata (Fabricius, 1794): Interesting phenological data from Madrid (central Spain) (Crambidae: Pyraustinae)

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Goater (1986) cites this crambid (Fig. 1) as an important migrant being distributed from south-central Europe through the Indo-Tropics to Australia. Gómez de Aizpúrua (1990) and Sarto i Monteys (2002) cite it in Mediterranean Spain from NW Madrid through to Barcelona. In terms of its phenology in Spain, Gómez de Aizpúrua (1990) mentions it as monovoltine, whilst Sarto i Monteys (2002) state the 'probability' that it is bivoltine. In Madrid, Gómez de Aizpúrua (1990) states that larvae are found from the 'second half of July until the end of September'.

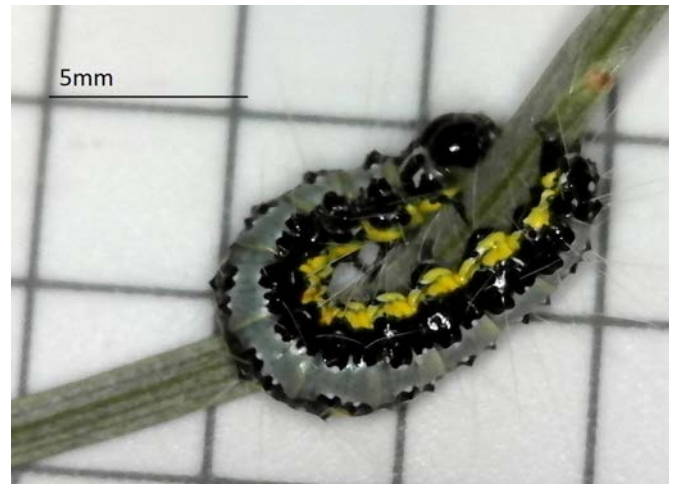
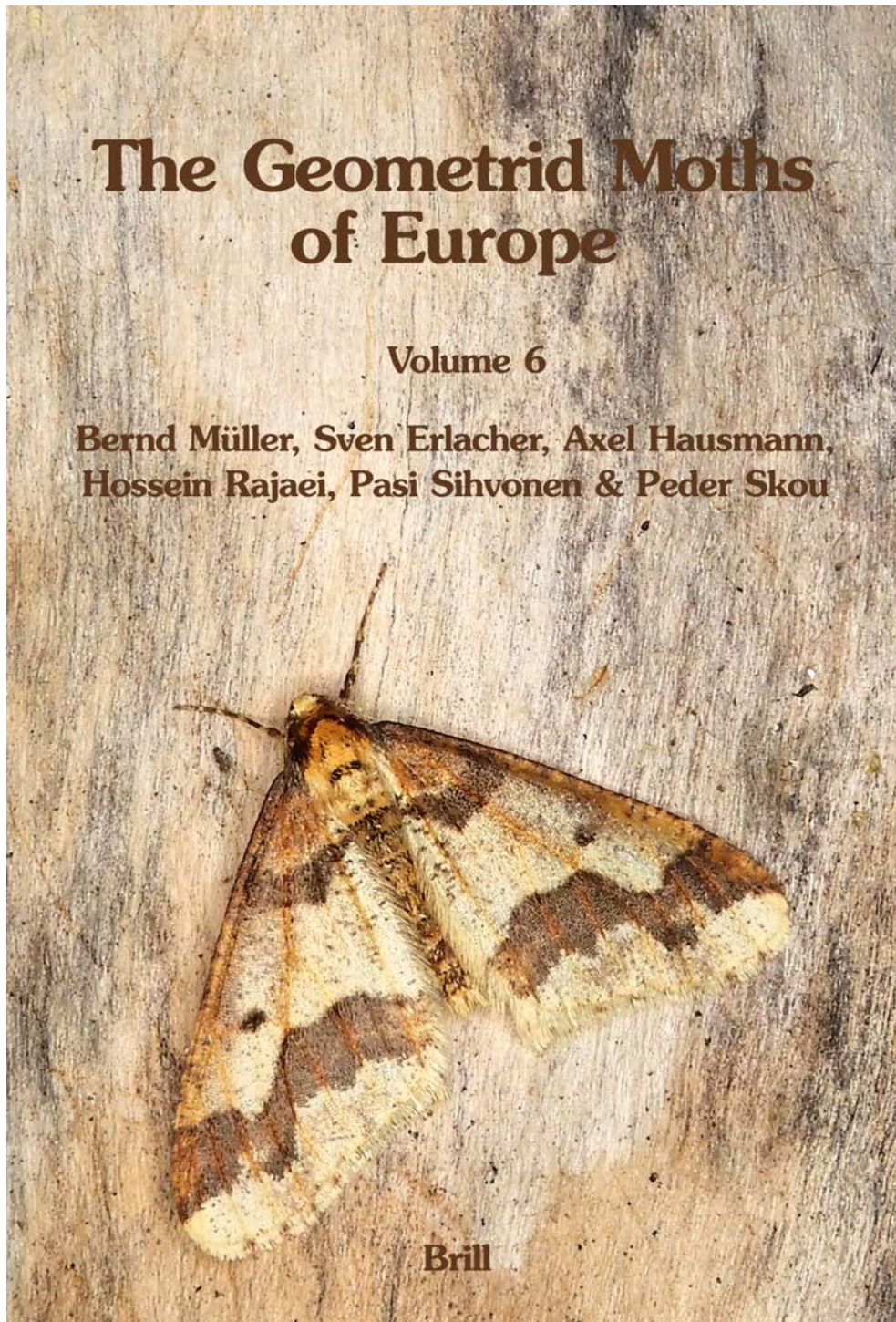


Figure 2. *Uresiphita gilvata* (Fabricius, 1794): L5 larva 14.x.18, El Goloso, Madrid.

Recent experience with the larvae (Fig. 2) of this species in terms of field data from Madrid since 2000 (based on field observations per se rather than a concrete methodology) would suggest that this moth is probably tri-voltine

and that its ecological status as an r-strategist would suggest that it is able to overwinter either as a cocoon or as a larva.

Material examined or observations in field.

Los Perales, El Goloso, Madrid (720m): imago observed: 11.iv.14; imago observed: 3.iv.15; various larvae always in *Lygos sphaerocarpa* (Fabaceae): 17.v.15, 23.v.15; 3.x.15, 6.x.15; 5x L5 larvae: 12.xi.16; 4x L4, L5 5.xi.17, 3x L5 9.xi.17, several 18.xi.17, 1x L5 14.xii.17, 3x L5 13.i.18; 2x L5 26.v.18, 5x L5 27.v.18, several L3, L5 14.x.18; Valdemoro, La Cañada (600m): 2x L5: 12.vii.00.

The larvae collected January 2018 produced imagines 24.ii.18–1.iii.18; larvae have also produced adults in the winter on previous occasions, e.g. larvae collected in

October 2015 produced imagines as from 19.xii.15 although this could be an artefact of artificial conditions.

New Publications

Volume 6 of the book series *The Geometrid Moths of Europe* to be published by June 2019!



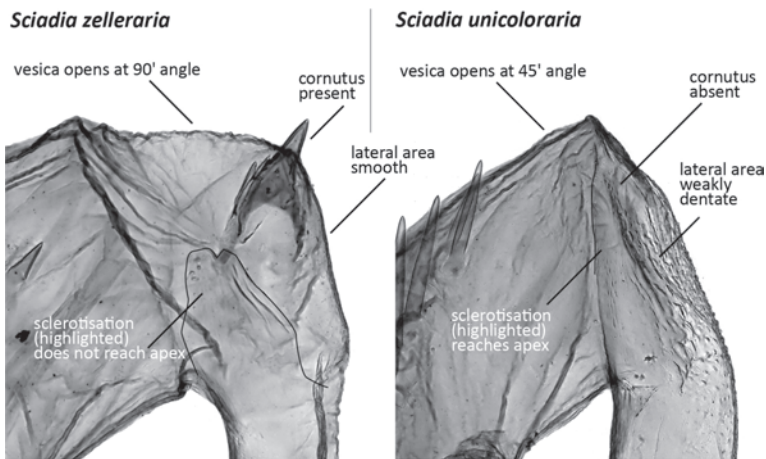
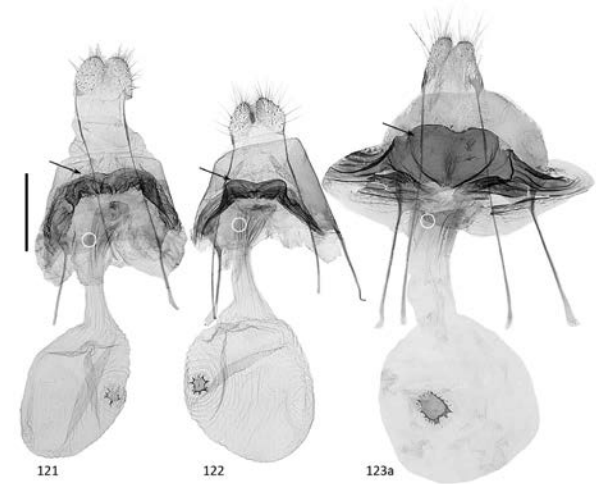
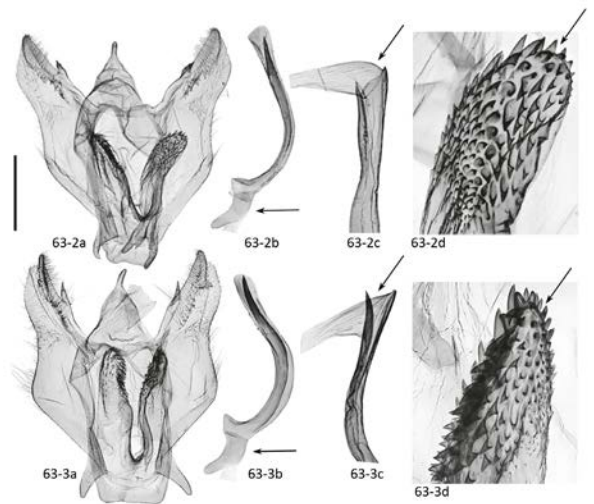
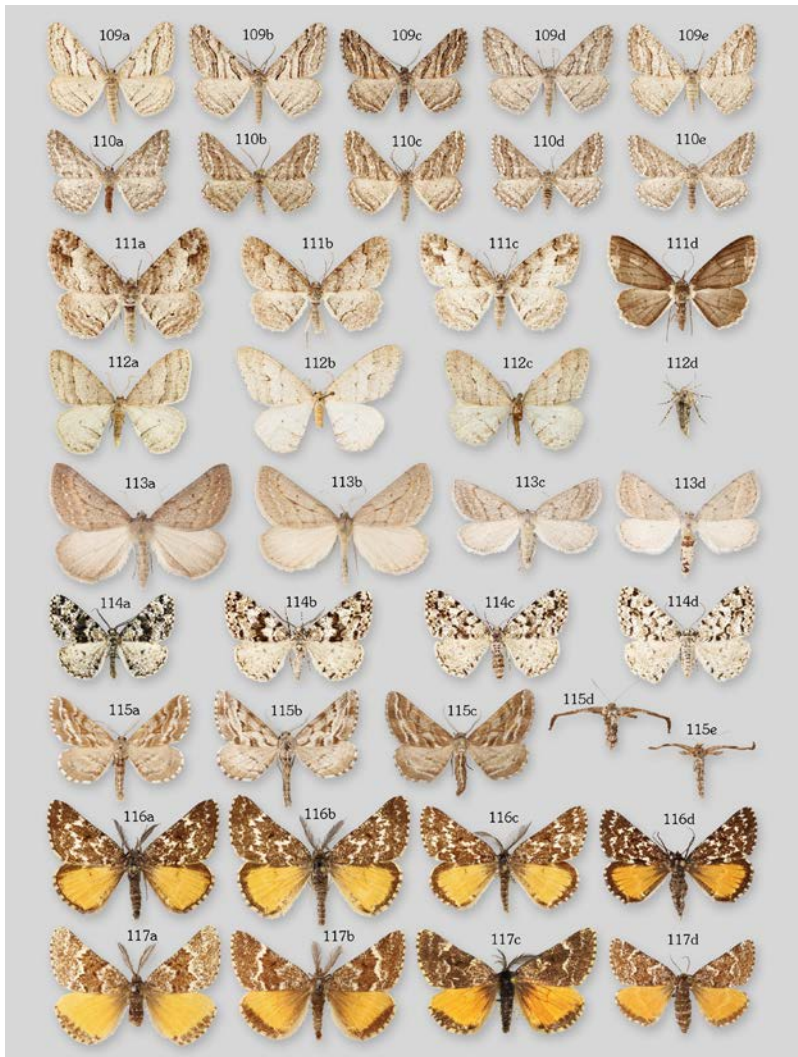
The book is aimed for professional researchers and amateurs as well interested in geometrid moths, and it is a must have for institutes, entomological societies, libraries and museums.

This volume presents the second and concluding part of the revision of the European taxa of the subfamily Ennominae, cover-

ing 181 species focusing on tribes Gnophini and Boarmiini. This volume presents also 21 additional species which have been recorded as new for the fauna of Europe since the publication of the volumes 1–5.

Volume 6 is expected to be the largest in the series with more than 900 pages. In summary,

over 140 taxonomic changes are proposed, including for instance descriptions of 4 new species and nearly 100 species- and subspecies-level synonymies. Several difficult genera such as *Charissa*, *Psodos*, *Sciadia*, *Nychiodes*, *Selidosema*, *Peribatodes* and *Tephronia* complex are covered.



As in previous volumes, all species are presented with their full name, reference to the original description, fully referenced junior synonyms, (potentially) unavailable names, description, distribution, phenology, biology including host plants, habitat, differential features from similar species, genetic data and remarks if needed. All 202 species are illustrated in 30 colour plates comprising a total of 1,116 specimens. Male and

female genitalia structure of all species are illustrated in 131 grey-scale photo plates. Distribution in Europe and adjacent countries is shown on maps for all species. Tens of text-figures illustrate and explain diagnostic characters and other morphological structures for difficult groups. Additionally, an updated systematic and annotated checklist of the Geometridae of Europe and adjacent areas is provided for volumes 1–6.

The authors hope to be able to present the book at the XXIth European congress of Lepidopterology, Campobasso, Italy, 3rd to 7th June 2019.

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
